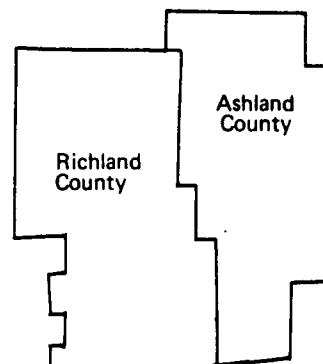

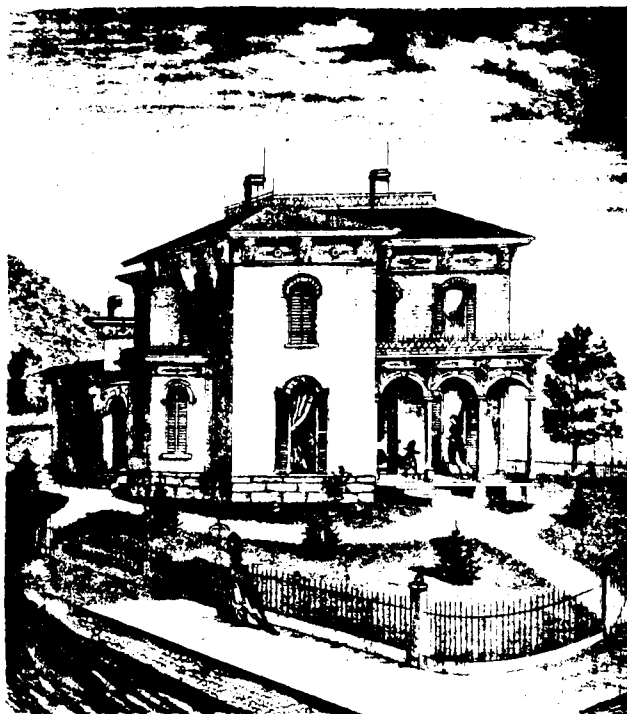

DEATH NOTICES, ASHLAND TIMES, 1854

- 12 Jan Died in this twp. on the 3rd of Jan. Mr. Joseph SLOAN.
- 9 Mar Died on the 25th Feb., of paralysis, Daniel CARTER, Sr., one of the oldest and most respectable inhabitants of this county.
- 23 Mar Died on the evening of the 21st inst., Mrs. Elizabeth JENKINS, wife of Mr. F. JENKINS, aged 25 years. The deceased returned to this town from the west in Oct., last, with her health greatly impaired... She has left a little daughter about 3 mo.
- 20 Apr Died on the morning of the 26th of Mar., near Hayesville, Lydia, wife of Joseph WORKMAN, Fsq., aged 64 years.
- 27 Apr A man by the name of A. SPROTT, a blacksmith, who resided some 2 miles north of the village of Orange was drowned in one of the small lakes near Savannah on Sat. afternoon last.... The deceased leaves a widow and six children.
- 25 May Died at the res. of his father near this place on the 11th inst., Mr. J.J. BFFR, aged 28 years. He was connected for a number of years as an operator on the Cleveland and Columbus telegraph line at the stations of Mansfield, Wooster and Ashland.
- 20 Jul Thomas STRINGER was shot near James-town, California. Leaves a wife and children.
- 3 Aug Died on yesterday evening the 2nd inst., after a few hours illness, Elizabeth Anna, daughter of Frank JFNKINS in the 8th month of her age.
- 17 Aug Died at Norwalk, on Sun., last, of Cholera, Mrs. Mary FARR, wife of

- 31 Aug Died on Sun., Aug 10th, after an illness of 4 weeks, Florence Isodene, eldest daughter of J.W. and H.N. McDOWELL, aged 4 years, 9 months and 10 days...
- 7 Sep Died on Mon., the 4th inst., of Cholera Infantum, Willie Clark, the only child of John and Eveline SHFRIDAN, aged 2 mos. and 24 days.
- 14 Sep Died on the 7th Inst., in Canaan Twp.,

Wayne Co., Ohio, Mr. Samuel WIREMAN, of Typhoid Fever, aged 74 years.
 4 Oct Died on the 28th Sept., John F., son of Curtis A. and Ann Elizabeth HUMES, aged 9 months.
 18 Oct Died Sept. 23d, Anne MILLER, consort of Col. Alexander Miller of this vicinity. The deceased was among those who early settled this part of Ohio...She died 50 yrs., 7 mos., 10 days.
 2 Nov Died on the 23d ult., Dr. Parvin McCoyd MILLER, a physician, who lately had done an extensive practice at Rowsburg, breathed his last after an illness of 4 weeks. He leaves a wife to mourn his loss.



2 Nov On the 21st ult., S.G. WOODRUFF, a young and enterprising farmer, living near our village, who had formerly been a merchant in this place was riding a horse near his res., when the animal becoming entangled in some telegraph wire which had just fallen, fell and threw Mr. Woodruff with great violence on a bridge fracturing his jaw and producing undoubtedly, some injuries in his head. The broken bones and bruises were skillfully dressed and it was expected that no fatal results would ensue, but on Thurs., last, he commenced bleeding in his nose and mouth and after that gradually weakened until on Sun. morning at 10 o'clock, he expired...
 16 Nov Died in Ruqgles, Nov. 12, Mr. James CARNEY, at the age of 90 years, 1 month. Mr. Carney was a Revolutionary soldier, a drummer and was at the battle of White Plains.

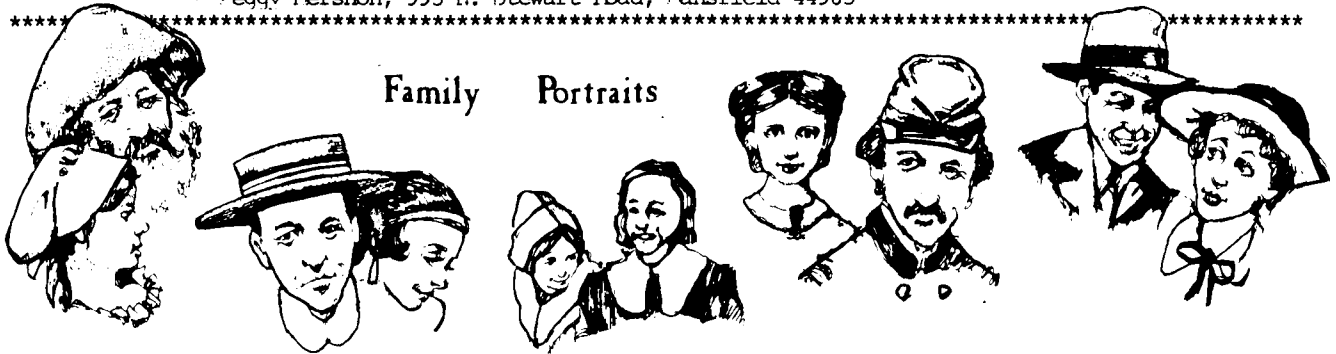

Family Portraits

GEORGE ARNHOLT

George Arnholt, son of Michael Arnholt and Margaret Weifs, was born 3 Jun 1826, and baptized 8 Jun 1826 at Croth, County of Seltz, District of Wijsembourg, State of Base Rhine, France. On 5 Apr 1840, he was confirmed as a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

On 12 Apr 1840, he departed with his parents to America and arrived at Loudonville, Ashland Co., Ohio, on 4 Jul 1840.

On 20 Sep 1849(?), he was married by Pastor Charles Kunert to Maria Wolljing(?), daughter of Nicolaus and Maria Wolljing. She was born 25 Dec 1832, in Lake Township, Wayne County, Ohio.

Their children were: Henry born 23 Dec 1851, Jefferson Township, Knox County, Ohio; Maria Elizabeth, born 9 May 1856, Jefferson Township, Knox County, Ohio; and George, born 28 Apr 1858, baptized 3 Jun 1858, Hanover Township, Ashland County, died 4 Jun 1858, buried 6 Jun 1858, Loudonville Cemetery.

RICE/MIDDLESWART families

Zachariah Rice (1731-1811) was in America in 1751. Maria (Abigail) Hartman (1742-1789) was in America in 1750. They married in 1759 in Chester County, Pa., where they became the parents of 21 children.

They were both named non-military patriots in the Revolutionary War for their work in a hospital. They purchased land for farming but later lost it due to prior claims on the land. Abigail died at 47 years of age, and Zachariah took 17 children to

Juniata County, Pa., at age 60, and began again. He paid off his farm in about 10 years, and lived to be 80.

His son, Peter (1764-1839), married Marie Foose, and his grandson, Zacharia Rice (1786-ca.1846) married first Esther Weishaupt and second Catherine Weishaupt and lived in Richland County.

The second Zachariah's son, Samuel (1818-1902), married Rebecca Middleswart in 1847 at Shelby, Richland County, and left for the Gold Rush in California in 1853 via Nicaragua. They remained in California to raise four daughters and he became an important farmer.

Their daughter, Lorena, married Emerson Hixson in 1876. Emerson and Lorena's mother shared the same Van Middleswart ancestry. Jan Teunise and a brother assumed the name, Van Middleswart (or similar spelling) in 1654. Five generations of Dumons in New Jersey and three generations of Hixsons in New York, Michigan and California led to Emerson. The other line leading to Rebecca traveled across Pennsylvania and West Virginia to Richland County. I can identify all but one or two generations on this line and would appreciate assistance making the connection.

Emerson and Lorena Rice Hixson were my mother's grandparents.

The Rice family history is a brief summary of an article in "The Fistle," a monthly news magazine of the Bachelor, Carver and Rice families, Jan-Feb 1978, Rosemary Bachelor, editor.

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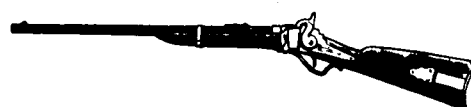
