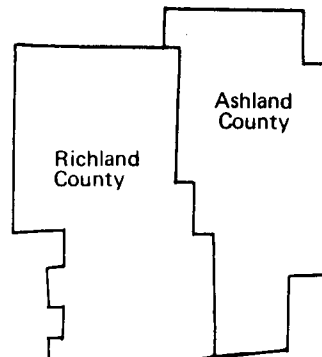

DEATH NOTICES, THE ASHLAND TIMES, 1855

- 1 Feb John SHIVELY, a young man residing near this place, was assisting on a thrashing machine one day last week, when the cylinder of the machine burst and struck young Shively.... Shively died on Tues. morning last, from the effects of the wounds. He was 22 years old.
- 5 Apr Died in Ashland, 27th of Mar., Adaresta, daughter of Charles A. and Margaret M. TOWSLEE, aged 12 months, 10 days.
- 7 Jun William PHILIPS, a son of D.J. Philips met with a sad accident on Sat. of the week before last. While out in the woods near town with some other boys having climbed a tree, the branch, on which he was seated broke and he was precipitated to the ground, striking as he fell a sharp stick which ran into his body.... He died on Sat. last.
- 14 Jun On Sat. last... Nicholas GLENN, a wealthy farmer... was drowned in a small branch leading into the Jerome Fork. This creek which is so small rarely creates an impediment to those desiring to cross it, was swollen by the heavy storm of Sat. evening to an unprecedented height. About 11 o'clock in the evening Mr. Glenn started with a young man, to a field on the opposite side of the creek for the purpose of taking some cattle off a low piece of ground. They both had lanterns and crossed the creek on a log safely. Having accomplish-

- ed their object, they proceeded to return home, when Mr. Glenn observed that he would ford the stream instead of walking on the log. He started to do so holding on to the log with one hand. The young man preceded him on the log and looking back saw the lantern of Mr. Glenn disappear suddenly, heard some struggling but no other noise. Mr. Glenn had sunk into the waters and was carried down the heavy current. His body was found the next morning some distance below. His funeral took place on Monday.
- 28 Jun The funeral of the late Mr. Uriah

- 5 Jul John FREER, a son of Daniel J. Freer was drowned while swimming in Jerome Fork some five miles from town, on Saturday last. He was 9 years of age.
- 12 Jul Died at his res. in Ashland, June 27th, of Dyspepsia, Uriah DRUMB aged 66 years, 10 months. Mr. Drumb was one of the first settlers in the vicinity of Ashland, having resided here upwards of 30 years...

THE FAST FAMILY REUNION

The first reunion was held 100 years ago on Wednesday, June 6, 1883, on the Christian Fast homestead in Orange Township, Ashland County, across the road from Savannah-Spring Lake. Between 300 and 400 people signed a book as being connected with the family, but it must have been a community affair as well, for food was served from two tables, each about 225 feet long, and a count of nearly 1,000 was made during dinner, with more sitting around eating their own lunches.

Christian Fast and Anna Barbara Mason had been married 100 years earlier, on August 1, 1783, in Fayette County, Pa. They lived in Dunkard Township, Greene Co., Pa., until 1815 when they moved to Orange Township here. Three of their 13 children (two more died young) were still living in 1883 -- George on the home farm; Francis at Camden Center, Mich.; and Christena, widow of Nathaniel Bryte, in Prairie City, Ill. Descendants of Christian's and Barbara's brothers and sisters also lived in Ashland County.

Relatives came in 1883 from Michigan, Illinois and Indiana as well as other Ohio counties. Because of the distances, the

next family reunions were not held until 1886, 1887 and 1891. Since then, they have been annual, so this centenary one, held June 12 at the Ruggles Grange Hall, is the 96th. Interest and attendance have varied over the past few decades, being so low at times that discontinuance was considered. Probably one bond that kept it going was that the reunion served to retell the story of Christian Fast's Indian captivity during the Revolutionary War. This romantic adventure gave us something to tie to, a sense of something shared. This is especially need as our lives and interests have become so diverse. The recent resurgence of interest in genealogy has fostered research into other family lines and more contact with distant relatives who hold annual reunions in Celina, Ohio, and Lamar, Mo. This has resulted in the printing of a family history compiled some years ago by Wirt Faust and the anticipation of a supplement by Robert Fast of the Celina group documenting recent research done in Germany and Pennsylvania.

Thought and effort need to be put into making a reunion program interesting and sociable, with something for all ages. This is not easy when most of the people see

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each other no more than once a year and share only a tenuous tie, but it does seem to be worth an attempt to communicate some enthusiasm. We wonder how far into another century to Fast Reunion will last.

The following clipping was pasted on a page in the Bible:

"Mary Ellen, wife of T.C. Wood, and daughter of W.F. Tyler, of this city died at her home in East Hamblin, N.Y. June 19th after an illness of only a few days. She was raised and married in Mansfield, was 35 years of age and mother of four children, who, with husband and parents survive with one brother and two sisters left to mourn her early departure."

(W.F. TYLER lived in Mansfield, Ohio, and buried there.)

Enclosed (in the Bible?) was this letter from W.F. TYLER, dated 25 Mar 1899, Mansfield, Ohio, to his son, Dexter (W.D. TYLER):

(Abstracted)"Dexter: I dont know as what i am about to write will interest you very much.

"This party in Chicago that is preparing the Tyler Family History has gotten along with it and find that his line of Descendants and mine are all the same -- spring from Job TYLER, who Emigrated to America in 1640.

"Respectfully, From Pa."

The enclosure is the Biographical Record of the TYLER Family back to 1640 as written by W.F. TYLER:

"William Dexter Tyler of Wooster, Ohio, was born near Cooperstown, N.Y., Feb. 7, 1853. He is the son of:

"William F. TYLER, who was born June 7, 1827, in Newport, Herkimen, N.Y. He is the son of:

"Samuel TYLER who was born Jan. 17th, 1795, d Feb 17 1879, aged 84y, 1 m. He is the son of:

"William TYLER who was born Aug. 4, 1764, in Attleboro, Mass., near Rhode Island line. He moved early to Western Mass. with a brother, Thomas, who lived and died at Adams, Mass. William in 1781 for 3 years and saw service in New York State which turned his thots (sic) to moving there. He was the son of:

"Nathan TYLER of Attleboroughs and served in the Revolutionary War. He was the son of:

"Captain Samuel and he the son of: "Samuel who fought in King Philip's War. He was the son of:

"Job TYLER who was the emigrant to America, and the actual first settler of the famous old town of Andover, Mass. in year 1640.

"My father was born Jan. 17, 1795, in Newport, Herkimen, N.Y. died Feb 17, 1879 at Mansfield at my house, his age was 84y 1m. My parents were married as near as i can remember about 1820 in Newport, Herkimen Co. N.Y. They both died in Mansfield, Ohio and are buried on my family lot in Mansfield Cemetery where all our records will be found for generations to come.

"My mother was Betsy Elizabeth POOL, born in Stepentown, Renseler Co., N.Y. in year 1800 in Mch i think but not positive. Died Feb 24 1863 age 63y in Mansfield, Ohio. Her fathers name Elisha POOL born Jan 9, 1769, in Little Hoosac Albany Co. N.Y. died Sept 1800 age 36 ?. I cannot give her mothers maiden name, unless it might have been VINCIENT.

"John POOL, the father of Elisha POOL, my mothers grandfather, died at Little Hoosac May 11, 1783, in 50th year of age.

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Sarah POOL, his wife died June 3 1796 in her 67th year.

"My wifs name was (maiden) Hannah PRATT born in Burlington, Otsego Co N.Y. 19th Oct 1826--d- Oct 27 1875 age 69 years 4 days. We were married in Burlington Aug 22 1849.

"My wifes father wa Eliaha PRATT, born in Burlington, Otsego N.Y.

"Elisa PRATT died Aug 4 1870 age 89 years and 22 days.

"My wifes mother Sarah SMITH wife of Elisha PRATT died May 11 1844 age 54 years and 4 months."

Hand written note:-

"My Father TYLER had no brothers and only two sisters. His oldest sister having only one daughter-Mrs Emma RISLEY, who lived at Hamilton, N.Y. and her only son, a teacher in College there

"Her father is still living. His youngest sister, Mrs STOLER, left one daughter, Libbie STOLER, who lives in Orlando, Fla. (Orange Co.) Dever Lives in Omaha Neb. He is in Real Eastate. She has two brothers.

"Mrs. Jenet PIERCE (mothers oldest sister) Onconta Otsego Co. NY She has only



one child, a widowed daughter, Mrs T A WAYWARD, who lives with her,-no children.

"Mrs. Zidana SMITH, Garrettsville, NY, Otsego Co., mother youngest sister. She lives with a daughter her only child.

"Henry and John MURDOCK-Henry lives in Cooperstown, Otsego Co NY and John in Toddsville, 3 miles from Cooperstown.

"Their only sister, Mrs. W.P.K. FULLER, lives in Cooperstown, Her husband is Teller in the Bank there.

"These three are Mothers sisters Sara's Children. She being dead. Henrys oldest son being a Methodist preacher."

Clippings and enclosures in the Bible:

Mrs. W.F. TYLER obituary:-"The deceased was a daughter of Capt. Elisha PRATT, of near Cooperstown, NY. She was 69 years of age last Saturday and was married to W.F. TYLER, Aug 22 1849 and came with him to Mansfield in 1859.

"Those who survive-a son W.D. TYLER (Walter Decter), who resides at Wooster, Ohio, Mrs. Warren LAIRD of Columbus, Ohio and Mrs. Clarence HOOVER of this city (Mansfield)."

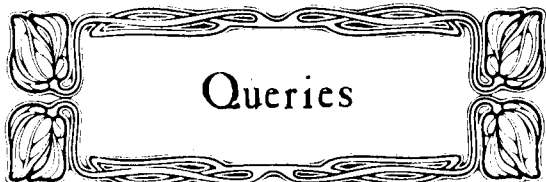
