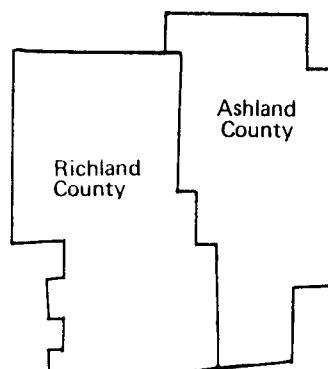

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DEATH NOTICES FROM THE ASHLAND TIMES, 1860

26 Jan Died on the 16th inst. at her res. near Pleasant Ridge, Mrs. Elizabeth KIPP, aged 69 years, 10 months & 28 days.

On the 23 inst., infant son of Mr. & Mrs. C. FRANCE, aged 1 year, 3 months & 7 days.

On the 23 inst. at the res. of his father, Samuel, son of James & Rhoda McCOOL, aged 12 years. This is the second child of Mr. & Mrs. McCool that has passed away within one year.

"Scarlet Fever" -- This dreadful scourge among children prevails in the portions of the northern townships of this county. Three interesting children of Mr. A.W. PURDY of Ruggles Twp. died of the disease recently within intervals of only 2 or 3 days.

We were pained to hear yesterday that Mrs. SUTHERLAND, widow of John Sutherland who resides 2 miles south of this place and who has been on a visit to her children in Wyandotte (sic) Co. in this state and just starting for her home in this county, met with a very serious, if not fatal, injury by the cars at Upper Sandusky. It seems that a freight train was standing upon a side track through which she had to pass to reach the passenger train and while passing through the freight train started, throwing her down and dragging her the distance of 100 feet . . . .

2 Feb Mrs. SUTHERLAND's injuries proved fatal and she died on Thurs. morning last. The remains were brought to this place for interment on Saturday . . . . Mrs. Sutherland was one of the early settlers of the County . . . Her age was 64 years.

9 Feb Died on Mon. eve. at the res. of her

son, J.D. STUBBS, Mrs. Mary STUBBS, aged 62 years and 7 months . . . an active member of the M.E. church.

23 Feb Died suddenly of Apoplexy near West Salem on the 7th inst. Rev. Adam HENNEY, aged 65 years, 10 months and 28 days. The deceased emigrated from Centre Co., Pa., in the year 1815 and settled in Jackson Twp., Ashland Co., where he lived for 45 years . . . . He was one of the early pioneers of this county, traveled as an itinerant minister for 6 years, belonged to the Evangelical Association of Albrights. . . .

8 Mar Died on the 22d ult. of Typhoid Fever, Samuel BAUM Jr. in the 24th year of his age.

On the 5th inst. Nicholas RUTAN of Milton Twp., aged 74 years. The deceased was one of the old pioneers of this county and an old soldier of the war of 1812, having emigrated to this county about the year 1820, and has since resided on the farm on which he died.

At Orange on the 28th ult. John LONG, aged 20 years, 2 months and 19 days of Epileptic Fits . . . .

15 Mar Died in Ashland Mar 5th, the infant child of C.A. and M. TOWSLEE, aged 6 weeks and 1 day.

29 Mar In passing the old burying ground on Wed. last, we noticed a number of men engaged in disinterring some dead bodies preparatory to removal to the new cemetery. Stopping a minute or two, the coffin of Benj. EMMEN's son was taken up and upon opening it the body was found to be perfectly petrified . . . . He had been dead but 8 years.

19 Apr . . . Four years ago it will be recollected that about that time a man named WHITNEY, a wealthy farmer living near Loudonville was attacked one night when on his way home, horribly beaten with a club and his purse taken from him. He had sufficient strength to drag himself to his house, but died from the effects of the injuries in a few hours . . . .

10 May Died on the 4th inst. with dropsey of the heart, Ruth SPAFFORD consort of Henry Spafford aged 60 years 10 months, 12 days.

At Ashland on the 7th inst. Mary Jane, adopted daughter of Dr. P.H. and Elizabeth CLARK, aged 11 years and 8 months.

7 Jun Died in Ashland of congestion of the brain, Theodore, only child of Albert and Lydia ESTELLE, aged 4 years

1 month and 14 days. The circumstances connected with the death of this interesting child are particularly painful, the parents having a short time since left old friends and old associations and now have to meet their great trial among strangers.

5 Jul Died of consumption on the 24th inst., Uriah WHITMARSH, in the 30th year of his age.

Also on the 1st day of June, Emma D. infant daughter of Uriah and Elizabeth WHITMARSH, aged 15 months.

Near Ashland on Mon. 28th June, after a protracted and painful illness, Sister Harriet THOMAS, wife of Peter THOMAS, aged 40 years, 2 months . . . . She was a member of the Presbyterian Church until within 4 years of her death and . . . . united with the Disciples of Christ.

In Perrysville, Ashland County, Acy ROE, aged 55 years. The deceased was born in New Hampshire, left his home and his friends and came to this place 25 years ago where he resided for 13 years when he left and wandered as a journeyman shoemaker over the state, returning but 3 months ago to this place to die where he had spent so many happy years in the employ of our kind and generous townsman, T.W. COULTER, who bestowed on him during his long illness every comfort and care his kind heart could conceive. He was a penniless wanderer but his friends here were many. He was attended through his sickness by our respected and talented townsman, Dr. J.F. JOHNSON. His disease was Phthisic pulmonate.

26 Jul The little son of Mr. STEARNS, hotel keeper at Perrysville, while bathing in the Black Fork of Mohican was accidentally drowned on Fri. morning last . . . . The child was about 10 years of age.

Died near Ashland on the 20th of April, Mr. William FIGLEY, aged 44 years, 3 months, 3 days.

A man and a boy, names not known, were struck by lightning on Thurs. afternoon last in Lake Twp. of this county. During the heavy rain of that afternoon, they took refuge under a tree which was struck passing down the tree and killing the man and boy instantly.

9 Aug The names of the persons killed by lightning in Lake Twp. of which we gave notice 2 weeks since were Mr. John KICK and son.

23 Aug Died suddenly on the 17th inst. of disease of the heart Mr. John HERBRAND in the 45th year of his age.

6 Sep Died in Genesco, Ill., Aug 27th, Douglas Warner, son of E.N. and S.C. GATES, aged 6 months.

27 Sep Died on the 20th inst., Andrew HOUSEHOLDER in the 73d year of his age . . . He was an old and esteemed citizen of Mohican Twp.

25 Oct Died at the res. of her husband on the 18th inst. after a painful and protracted illness of several months, Mrs. S. WERTMAN, wife of W. WERTMAN, in the 45th year of her age.

On the 15th inst. at his late res. in Ashland, Mr. Abraham HUFFMAN aged nearly 70 years . . . . He came to the state . . . in 1815.

1 Nov Died on the morning of 31st of Oct., John JACOBS, Sen. in the 63rd year of his age. Mr. Jacobs . . . removed from Reading, Pa., to this place in the year 1827 where he has resided ever since. At his death he held both the office of Twp. and county treasurer . . . . His funeral will take place from his late res. in south Ashland.



At Hayesville Oct 23d, Mary Ida McNEAL aged 2 years, 6 months, 10 days. Her death was occasioned by her clothes taking fire at the stove during the temporary absence of her mother and other members of her family. She lived 10 days . . . without scarcely uttering a cry.

8 Nov Died in Ashland on the 11th inst. Mary Bell, daughter of John and Elizabeth RISSER, aged 3 years, 8 months.

13 Dec Died on the 3d inst. of Scarlet Fever, Odelpha May, oldest twin daughter of David and Mary M. RICE, aged nearly 2 years.

On the 10th inst. at his res. in Perry Twp. of Dropsical affection, Mr. Valentine EBERT in the 64th year of his age. Mr. Ebert was a native of the state of Maryland. He came to this county as early as 1819 and settled on the same tract of land on which he died. He was a farmer by occupation . . . . He was a member of the Disciple Church of Christ . . . . He leaves a worthy companion.

27 Dec Died on the 23rd inst. of Scarlet Fever, Lavantia Annis, youngest twin daughter of David J. and Mary M. RICE, aged 1 year, 11 months.

In Sullivan, Nov. 21st of Dropsy on the brain, Frank A. only son of the late Dr. J.B. GORDON, aged 4 years, 1 month, 2 days.

On the 20th inst. of Croup, Victoria A., daughter of W.M. and M. MANSFIELD of this place, aged 1 year, 10 months, 14 days.

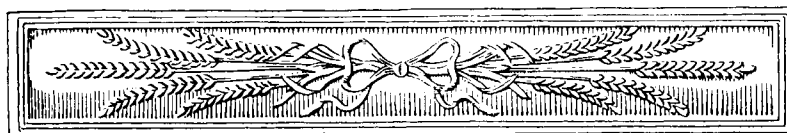
now in my possession. . . . Since the clipping was marked "1857" and since the issue of the Pastfinder loaned to me noted that Ashland Times issues for 1856-1858 are missing from the Ashland Library microfilm file, I wondered if the clipping might have been taken from the Times. I decided to inspect the reverse side... to see if by some remote chance it might provide a clue to the clipping's source. I was amazed to discover a portion of the masthead definitely identifying the Ashland Times as the source... Perhaps some of your readers can correlate the 'vol. 5, no. 16' identification with the actual date of issue.

"Another surprising coincidence is that the masthead includes the name of Jeff (Louis Jefferson) Sprengle, who was not only owner and editor of the Times but also (if I have calculated my family relationships correctly) a half brother of Caroline Chapin.

"The lower inscription on the fly-leaf is too weak to reproduce well. It reads, 'Grandma Sprengle died March 14, 1882. Her daughter's Bible comes to me. -- Mrs. Caroline M. Blackburn.' The author of that inscription is my own grandmother who was born in Ashland in 1859. She was the daughter of Amelia Graham COOK and Henry Clay SPRENGLE, the latter being the younger brother of Louis Jefferson Sprengle."
