**STATE OF OHIO v LaMartine GREENWALD,  
Henry A.L. MARKEL, and George SNOOK**

This Ashland County case is continued from the November 2002 issues of *The Pastfinder*.

13 November 1890

Joseph CHARLTON, resided in Orange Twp 8 years; has known GLASS for 25 years.

Israel MARKEL, age 72, resided in Ashland 10 to 15 years and in Orange Twp previous to that; is the father of H.A.L. MARKEL.

David CARTER, age 75, resides 2 miles south of Ashland; knew GLASS 20 years.

William TOBIAS, age 33, resided in Ashland 13 years; is a grocer.

George STONE, age 50, resides 2 miles south of Ashland on Hayesville Road; lives in brick house near David CARTER.

Mrs. Emily STONE, the wife of George.

R. HEDDINGER, has run a bus for 3 years.

Alonzo WILLIAMS, an employee of F.E. MYERS & Bro., resides Walnut Street; uses McNULTY Alley when going over town.

Zebulon GLASS, age 54, in fall of 1889 lived on Orange Road next to Jacob SAAL; is a nephew of R.B. GLASS; he and GLASS both raised in Wayne Co; on good terms with Uncle Reason – “I never was in his house but once.”

G.I. YEARICK, office is up on the same stairway as MARKEL’s.

Byron STILLWELL, attorney, been in Ashland 16 years.

Jacob F. BENINGHOF, age 61, resided in Mifflin Twp since 1837; fair reporter, slept at T.M. BEER’s, boarded at SPRAGUE Hotel; saw Cooney LONG’s accident at fair.

Charles STEINMETZ, resided Ashland 14 years; employed by William TOBIAS.

D.S. LUCE, resided Ashland; jeweler 40 years; visited with GLASS when my father lived in Wayne Co.

Alfred STURGES, resides Clear Creek Twp; been in county since 1858; bought land from GLASS in spring 1889.

N.H. CHAPMAN, remembers VANTILBURG property being sold to GLASS.

John RICHARDS, resides Lima; was in dry goods business of RICHARDS & THOMPSON in GLASS Building in Ashland for 2 months.

J.A. STEVENSON, was with above dry goods business in Ashland.

Mrs. Cara DRAVENSTOTT, age 23, knew GLASS since childhood; married 2 years; separated since August 29<sup>th</sup>; resides with her mother, Mrs. Cyrus MARKLEY.

Jacob ZAPP, resides Ashland; harness maker; across street from MARKEL’s office.

C.P. WINBGLER, attorney since 1883; knew GLASS since 1872.

David ESHELMAN, resided in Ashland since 1881; knew GLASS 4 years; member Board of Trade; buys and trades real estate, for last 5 years.

Dr. I.F. MARKEL, brother of H.A.L. MARKEL; practiced medicine in Mifflin 14 years.

John CAMP, resides Perry Twp., farmer; leased a farm once from GLASS.

Joseph BRUBAKER, resides south of Ashland, farmer; made wooden sausage stuffer for GLASS.

Mrs. Art LEACHA, resided in Hayesville since 13 Aug 1889.

Dr. Frank COWAN, resides Ashland; rented room from GLASS for Masonic Lodge.

Max MECKES, resides Ashland; rented room from GREENWALD & GLASS on 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of VANTILBURG Building for Knights of Pythias.

M.R. SMALLEY, resides near Red Haw, farmer; leased farm in Clear Creek Twp from GLASS in spring 1888.

George SNOOK, age 39, born Milton Twp, resides ¾ mile west of Ashland; father lost all he had 15 years ago; lengthy testimony.

Don F. TAYLOR, practicing attorney 10 years; lives Center Street 3 houses south of GREENWALD.

David BRUBAKER, resides Ashland; dry goods business across from GREENWALD; mentions Z. GREENWALD.

Dr. P.H. CLARK, practicing medicine in Ashland 40 years; keeps meteorological records.

Dr. A.L. SHERICK, physician.

W.C. FRAZEE, in furniture/undertaking business; lives 5 houses south of GREENWALD.

Dr. GREENAMYER, a veterinary surgeon; resides Center Street, and passes GREENWALD house coming downtown [may be same as following person].

Dr. Frank GREENAMYER, veterinary surgeon.

Minor SWINFORD [sic], resides Ashland.

Dr. J.P. COWAN, resided in Ashland 30 years; served Ohio Legislature and U.S. Congress.

Jacob BRUBAKER, resided in Ashland 27 years; dry goods merchant; lives on Center Street.

James ODENKIRK, saw GLASS often.

T.B. AMBROSE, saw GLASS often.

John BENINGHOF, age 50, teamster.

N. CHAPMAN, resides near GREENWALD.

Mrs. H.A.L. MARKEL, wife of one of the defendants; mentions Mr. and Mrs. DAVIDSON and father and mother MARKEL being at fair.

Adam SPRINKLE, resides in Ashland; member Grand Jury in Sept 1889 along with George SNOOK.

George NICOL, attorney 2 plus years; partner with MARKEL; mentions Mrs. SLOCUM and SLOCUM girls being in his office.

H.D. GOULD, resides in Cleveland; coming there from Mt Union College; a commercial science teacher at Euclid Ave Business College; member SHARP’s College; handwriting expert; has been employed in Treasury Dept at Washington detecting forged signatures on bank notes; lengthy testimony; under cross-examination, became “befuddled”.

Ralph SMITH, resides Ashland; employed SHEARER, KAGEY & Co sawmill.

Alfred HART, resides Ashland; ran engine for Eureka Huller Co in Sept 1889.

Zeb GLASS, split wood for Arthur BEYMER; expects to move to CRAWFORD farm.

Miss Hattie SLOCUM, resides 1 ½ miles north of Ashland; knows H.A.L. MARKEL; mentions her sister.

Anna SLOCUM, resides north of Ashland [possibly the sister of Hattie].

John MYERS, resides Ashland; in lumber business and has planing mill.

Daniel WERTMAN, resides Ashland; works flax mill.

John SNOOK, age 70 years; father of George SNOOK.

Miss Sadie SNOOK, sister of George SNOOK.

Miss Stella BINKLEY, lives with George SNOOK.

Alex. DAVIDSON, on Sept 5<sup>th</sup> at dinner at Israel MARKEL's along with Henry MARKEL and wife.

Mrs. Alex. DAVIDSON, wife of above; cousin of H.A.L. MARKEL.

George STILLWAGON, knows MARKEL.

Curtis GLASS, brief testimony.

Lance FERREL, resides Ashland; horse dealer and owns farm.

Charles MARSH, telephone office is in his place of business.

N. CHAPMAN, worked in telephone office Nov 1889.

B.L. CHASE, resides Hayesville; bought VANTILBURG property for \$7500; 60 days later sold it to GLASS for \$8000.

Charles ULRICH, resides Ashland; employed by MARKEL & MANSFIELD in fall of 1889.

Robert COWAN, postmaster; Hayesville mail leaves at 3:00; "the carriers are allowed two hours on the road; they get to Hayesville generally at 4:30 p.m."

MANSFIELD – McCRAY read testimony of Wm. MANSFIELD before the probate judge at probating of alleged forged will.

Mrs. Marion GLASS, brief testimony.

John B. WEDDELL, resides Galion; civil engineer; was Ashland Co surveyor; moved "from here" 3 ½ years ago.

John DUNCAN, resides in Vermillion Twp.

Mrs. Alice GREENWALD, wife of Lamartine GREENWALD; daughter of Reason B. GLASS; mentions a Sheridan GREENWALD; lengthy testimony, interrupted by that of Mr. HARRIS.

Brougham HARRIS, Cleveland, undertaker of CROGAN & HARRIS; conducted funeral for W.W. PATTERSON in Cleveland 5 Sep 1889; testified that Mr. CAMPBELL attended that funeral.

Mrs. Alice GREENWALD, continued testifying details of GLASS death and subsequent events regarding the will.

#### 20 November 1890

Alice GREENWALD, married 17 years; denies having written letter to Curtis GLASS on 6 Dec 1889 or of sending son to MARKEL and telling him she wanted to file the will.

Sheridan GREENWALD, age 17, says grandfather [GLASS] gave him and his brother each 25 cents to go to the fair. Says GREENWALD told him to tell

MARKEL to file the will and that it was at his mother's request.

Sam R. JONES, notary public.

George ULLMAN, banker; said signature on original will did not match that on alleged forged will.

Laura CHERRY, resides Mansfield; niece of W.W. PATTERSON who died 2 Sep 1889 on Center Street; funeral Ashland 4 Sept, Cleveland 5 Sept; she and husband, Mr. and Mrs. LAKE, and R.M. CAMPBELL went to Cleveland for the funeral.

John H. CHERRY, attended funeral of W.W. PATTERSON in Cleveland 5 Sep [1889].

Arthur BEYMER, had Zeb. GLASS split wood in Spring of 1889. Asked Zeb if he was getting "boodle" out of this? "He said no; but I am going on the Clear Creek farm."

Dr. D.S. SAMPSEL, Jr., mentions that Mr. TOBIAS says balloon was going up at the fair on Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>. Under cross-examination: "I am at present under arrest for assault and battery with intent to kill." [Does this mean TOBIAS or SAMPSEL?]

George LUCE, was in SAMPSEL's office.

Samuel LEIDIG was on Grand Jury in March term; is an applicant for guard at Ohio Penitentiary.

Peter BECHTEL, resides Ashland; sells fish and buys poultry, for 10 years.

Minor testimony by Dr. B. MYERS, Daniel JOHNSON, W.T. ALBERSON, James BACKHOUSE, T.M. BEER.

Mrs. Maria BECHTOL, wife of Peter.

Louis WHITING, resides Ashland; foreman at Ashland Clover Huller Co.

Dr. C.B. WEEDMAN, resides Troy; son of George WEEDMAN, lately deceased; FREY filed medical malpractice suit against George WEEDMAN in fall of 1889.

Joseph MILLER, resides in Mifflin Twp.

Al HART, manipulator of engine for Huller Co. in fall 1889.

A.L. CURTIS, has resided at Ashland since 1847; lawyer.

The following testify that they went to the Ashland fair 5 Sep 1889 and did not see GLASS at the fair nor on the road to Ashland:

Edward DOW, left Hayesville and brought load of people to fair, right behind Art LEACH and wife.

Elizabeth FOX, resides Hayesville; went to fair with 6 relatives; LEACHes ahead of us.

A.C. FOX, resides east of Hayesville; was behind Ed DOW rig on way to fair.

William CIPHERS, in wagon with Ed DOW.

William CRAIG, ditto.

Alfred CRAIG, ditto.

J.O. FOX, in wagon with A.C. FOX.

C.B. FOX, resides 2 miles northwest of Hayesville.

Barney SEAMAN, to Ashland with Mr. GOARD on 5 Sep; did not see GLASS on road.

Upton ANDRESS, resides Hayesville; acquainted with Wm. NORTH; never offered him any money.

Jabez DICKEY, attorney for the state.

Wade ARMENTROUT, resides Hayesville.

Reuben BUTTLER, lives on GLASS farm in Clear Creek Twp; hauled oats 3 Sep 1889.  
 Milton WINBIGLER, Clerk of the Court, mentions an erasure of a court record, tampering.  
 C.M. VORCE, testifying again regarding the signatures on documents.  
 Jess HISSEM, resides Loudonville; attorney.  
 Samuel ARNOLD, Auditor of county; asked about amount of personal property tax GLASS paid.  
 Harry MYKRANTZ, attended court when argument was made on demurrer to FREY v WEEDMAN case.  
 B.L. CHASE, sold VANTILBURG property to GLASS.  
 Bur GRAY, son of D.B. GRAY, the liveryman.  
 William BOREN, coal dealer, sold GLASS 650 lbs coal on 3 Sep 1889.  
 Mrs. GREENWALD denies writing letter handed her by Dr. D.S. SAMPSEL, Sr.  
 Curtis S. GLASS, lengthy testimony.  
 Dr. Wade ARMENTROUT, unable to attend court; excuse written by Dr. KENDIG, submitted by Sam ANDRESS.  
 Lewis SATTLER, exhibited poultry and hog at fair.  
 Mrs. Marion GLASS, excused without further examination.  
 John CAMP, testifies CAMP lease all written at same time; VORCE disagrees.  
 Letters alleged to have been written by Alice GREENWALD and two by Lamartine GREENWALD published here.  
 Lengthy closing arguments presented, reviewing previous testimonies. Judge unprepared, case continued until morning.

#### 27 November 1890

Jury deliberated a little over an hour and by unanimous vote found each of the accused guilty. Men stoic. Wife of MARKEL cried. "It was a pity that she was there, but her womanly nature would not permit herself to be any other place." GREENWALD maintained innocence. Judge "roasted Lam in a seething manner." He accused him of being the ringleader of unscrupulous men, mutilating records, attempting to bribe jurors and witnesses and bringing son into his own crooked practices; 10 years hard labor in Ohio Penitentiary.  
 Henry A.L. MARKEL maintained innocence. Judge said MARKEL was favored with legal education, knew consequences, was at one time ready to admit guilt; 7 years hard labor in Ohio Penitentiary.  
 George SNOOK said he not guilty. Judge said he was not as well educated as others, would be more lenient; 5 years hard labor in Ohio Penitentiary.  
 Families stayed with them at jail until late evening. Some MARKEL children too young to understand. Taken to Columbus Tuesday, Nov. 25th. Request for new trial denied.  
 "H.A.L. MARKEL, on Monday night made an assignment of his property to Geo. A. NICOL for the benefit of his creditors. He assigns a house and lot in Bucyrus, two houses and lots in Delphos, a

stock of hardware in some foreign town, law and literary library."

"GREENWALD leaves for a long time a wife and two boys; MARKEL leaves a wife and four little children, and SNOOK, while not married, was the support of an aged father, whose past troubles have well nigh broken him down. Let charity and sympathy be extended to them in their misfortune.  
 "The GREENWALD case will go into history as one full of sensational episodes. The first arrest last winter was very sensational as people were unwilling to think that some of the gentlemen would lend themselves to any disreputable scheme. Then when the trial came on the first sensation was over MAHLER going crazy and his subsequent death. The next sensation was that of LEWIS going crazy over the talk about his being a witness, and the last was the sudden death of Mr. GIBSON, foreman of the jury . . . ."

GIBSON began walking home about noon on Thursday, there being none in court from his neighborhood. When about a mile south of Savannah he was passed by men who asked him to get in and ride, but he said he needed exercise and did not do as requested. The men, however, took his sachel [sic] and overcoat to relieve him of those burdens, and went their way. After they had gone a short distance one of them looked back, and did not see him following and remarked it to his companion. They both looked back and then discovered him lying in the road. They hurried back to him but could do nothing as he was then past human aid, death having already claimed him. He was one of Clear Creek township's prominent citizens, a man of about 63 years, a prominent farmer and a respected neighbor. For years he had been assessor and justice of the peace of his township...." Buried Saturday.

#### 30 October 1890

"J.P. MAHLER, the man who became insane while serving on the jury, died at the asylum last Thursday, and was brought to his home in Loudonville Friday for burial. The old man might yet have been living, had it not been for the excitement and worry over the case. He imagined many things and they no doubt contributed to his troubles."

Loudonville News - "The remains of Peter MAULLER arrived here from Toledo, Friday. The sad fate of the unfortunate jurymen has aroused a sentiment here that is anything but favorable toward those who in his delirium he imagined were hounding him to his death."

The teacher, Miss Ethel LYONS, of Bucyrus, and the pupils in the school who were fever patients have all fully recovered [*Loudonville Democrat*, Thurs., 15 Nov 1917, page 8, column 1].

Perrysville. The latter part of last week the electric light plant was moved from East First street across the railroad near the water works. Wm. HERMAN and force of men did the work [*Loudonville Democrat*, Thurs., 26 Jul 1917, page 3, column 1].

Wanted: Homes for Homeless Children. Persons desiring a good sized boy or girl to bring up, or a little child by adoption, will do well to see Dr. DARBY at the Hotel ULLMAN September 28<sup>th</sup> (Thursday of the Fair), or write The Children's Home Society, 34 West 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, Columbus, O [*Loudonville Democrat*, Thurs., 21 Sep 1916, page 8, column 2].

Centennial Families of Ashland County – those who descend from settlers of Ashland County who were perhaps not our earliest, but were here by 1900 –
